social media. Already-proffered suggestions include a splash pad, additions to the existing walking trail, and new playground equipment. "That costs \$20,000?" asked Muñoz.

"Yes, \$15,000 to \$20,000 is what we are looking at. We are hoping it will leverage us some money down the line," DiPiazza responded, noting that the cost could be covered by a combination of parks trust fund money and unspent funds in other areas.

The consultant would be tasked with prioritizing projects based on popularity among staff, council and the public, but not with writing grant applications. The consultant would also evaluate existing parks and recreation facilities to determine opportunities for improvements and additions and compile city demographics, growth and trends.

Councilman John Flores asked if the consultant would provide a timeline for proposed projects, as well as estimated costs, to which director of city planning Susan Ander-

decide whether or not to proceed," said city manager Vince DiPiazza.

PURCHASES

Council approved the purchase of a baler for the recycling center, and a service yard gate and pipe saw for the water and sewer departments.

Cost for the baler is \$7,900; service yard gate, \$5,961; and pipe saw, \$10,625.

"The recycling center operates with two cardboard balers. In July of 2018, one of the balers, which is a 1995 model, began to malfunction," noted public works director Juan Zamora.

Zamora said the equipment has a leaking hydraulic cylinder, and a hydraulic pump and directional valve that need to be replaced, but the parts are no longer available.

The current service yard gate is more than 20 years old and issues have popped up over the last five years.

"Without these gates, the equipment/vehicles are exposed to theft and/or vandalism," Zamora said.

A pipe saw is utilized by the water and sewer departments for repairs of water and sewer mains.

Uvalde County Sheriff's Office assisted with patrolling the area.

Uvalde Consolidated Independent School District announced a lockdown at 7:44 a.m. and lifted the lockdown at 8:55 a.m. At that time, eight individuals, including the driver who was a U.S. citizen, had been detained. Law enforcement remained searching for a possible ninth person.

Of the eight, one individual was located by Uvalde Police Department Officer Ruben Hernandez near Walgreens, 250 E. Main St., while another was spotted by UPD Cpl. Greg Villa behind Maxey Mart #5, 420 E. Main St. UCSO Deputy Ernie Guzman detained a female passenger at the Willie De Leon Civic Center, 300 E. Main St.

"The decision was made to implement a soft lockdown to continue to receive our students as

LAVA: Farmer lost goats to acidic mud

Cavalry base called Fort Inge, has long been known to geologists as a volcanic plug or lava neck.

It was created when magma hardened within a vent on the then-active volcano. When present, a plug can cause an extreme build-up of pressure if volatile-charged magma is trapped beneath it, and this can sometimes lead to an explosive eruption.

Ben Fuller, who ranches along the Leona River just downstream from Fort Inge, recently reported to the Uvalde County Sheriff's Office that he had lost goats to a fumarole or acidic mud pot that had opened up in a draw on his property.

"I've seen plenty of strange things in the

30 years that I've been ranching down here but this takes the cake," he told the Leader-News. "One day it's the same wet weather draw and the next this thing is a steaming pool of boiling mud. I was missing half a dozen yearling nannies and that's where I found them ... cooked clean to pieces in that stinking pool."

Fuller said he had no plans to vacate the ranch, despite mud pots and a potential volcanic eruption.

"I ain't got the time to go anywhere," he said

Claymore did not recommend evacuation, but counseled caution. "Volcanic eruptions have become much more predictable with today's state of the art equipment. You are not talking about some kind of Pompeii situation hitting

Uvalde," he said.

Uvalde County Judge Bill Mitchell said the USGS report would be discussed during the next meeting of commissioners' court.

"It's not exactly the kind of news you want to put in your Convention and Visitors Bureau brochure unless you are trying to attract the National Volcano Appreciation Society. Probably we will just take a guarded approach and trust the USGS to signal when it's time to leave," Mitchell said.
