Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain

To: All interested Agencies Federal, State, and Local, Groups and Individuals
 This is to give notice that Uvalde County under Part 58 has determined that the following proposed action regarding the **Uvalde County TxCDBG Contract No. 7218145 Colonia Construction Fund Project** is located in the 100-year floodplain and Uvalde County will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternative to locating the action in the floodplain and the potential impacts on the floodplain from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determination on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands. Sewer Improvements: Uvalde County shall provide first-time sewer service to twenty-seven (27) households in the colonia of Flores to remove a potential threat to public health. Contractor shall install twenty-seven (27) sewer yard service lines, mitigate all existing septic systems, and all associated appurtenances. The residents will be served by the City of Uvalde centralized wastewater system. This activity involves approximately eleven (11) acres of land located in the 100 year floodplain.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate impacts. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk. El contratista instalará una (1) estación elevadora, aproximadamente tres mil trescientos sesenta y cinco pies lineales (3,365 lf) de alcantarillado de cuatro pulgadas (4 ") y seis pulgadas (6"), bocas de acceso, cercas y todo lo relacionado anexas. El Condado de Uvalde proporcionará servicio de alcantarillado por primera vez a veintisiete (27) hogares en la colonia de Flores para eliminar una amenaza potencial para la salud pública. 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was quite impressed with the United Nations building which he described as "the most beautiful building on earth." There the students sat in on a meeting of the Security Council.

Besides historical and governmental sites, the students attended the Gary Moore Show and the Arthur Godfrey Talent Show and also shopped at Gimbels, Saks, and Macy's.

In his diary, Clapp concluded, "We who went on the trip all came back a little more grown up and better people for having gone. We all have a lot more respect for our country and for each other."

In 1961 another group of Uvalde students attended the inauguration of John F. Kennedy. Ann Beecroft, Class of '61, recalls that it was an extremely cold day, so cold that 87-year-old Robert Frost had a difficult time reading the inaugural poem as it was in

the mid-20s. Beecroft adds, "Besides the inauguration, we all went to a Johnny Carson show in New York and got to see the musical 'There's Trouble in River City.' Mrs. Kincaid and Mr. Ken Clapp were our chaperones.

I remember that Susan Noble, Phyllis Fulenwider, Mary Lou Carper, Jimmy Krivan and Johnny Winn were on the trip."

Mary Lou Carper Williamson recalls that Phyllis Jo Davenport, Ann Brasher, Jack McGinnis and Tommy Shockley were also on the trip "It was the trip of a lifetime, but we "little Texas kids" weren't prepared for the cold weather. We were also somewhat scared when a party car was hooked onto our train, and the partying adults passed in and out of our car.

When Judy Morgan's aunt, who lived in New York City, took us all to the exclusive Metropolitan Club, none of us had ever seen a finger bowl!"

Williamson remembers that the trip cost \$269.50 and included all meals and hotel rooms. Lou Fohn's friend Norman Massey went on the trip, but Fohn, UHS Class of '61, recalls that not everyone could afford the trip, so some students had sponsors who loaned them money in exchange for later working for them.

That \$269 in 1961 is equal to over \$2,000 in today's world.

When asked about the inaugural trip, there is still an excitement in the voices of those who were fortunate to experience that special journey to our nation's capital.

It was truly a trip of a lifetime.
